Have our ESL Coach meet with teachers to develop targeted instruction and lesson planning, and a schedule that will provide support to students using linguistic accommodations in the four domains-listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

Certified teaching staff implement researched based practices such as bilingual dictionaries, accommodations checklists, Duolingo, and visuals to help our ESL population show growth.

With increased enrollment and more students identified as Special Populations-ESL, we will need to provide indepth training on the *Linguistic Accommodations Guide* to help teachers implement accommodations to help our ESL students in the domains of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. 
